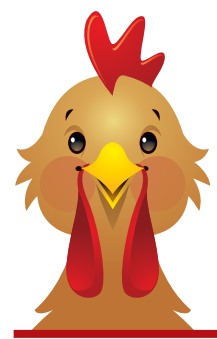

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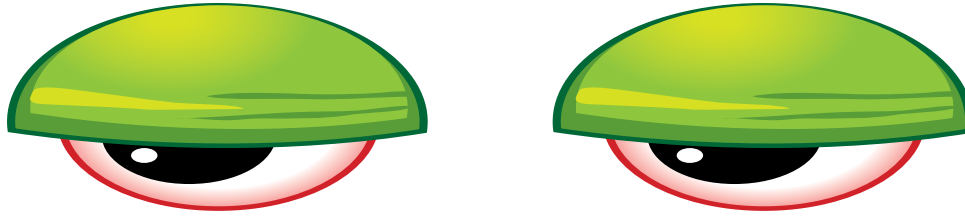

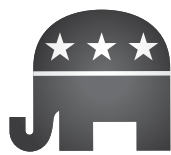

What would your priorities be as a member of the town council?

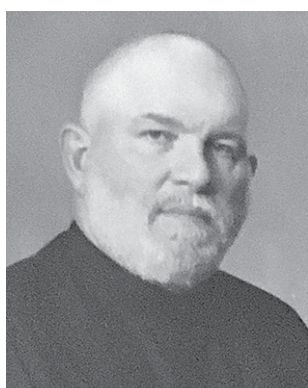

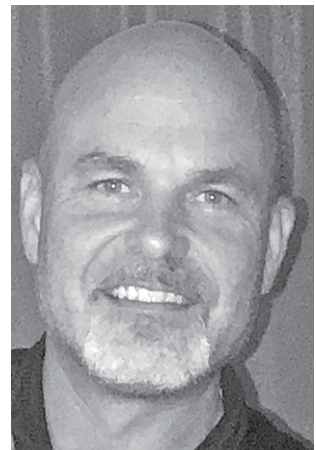

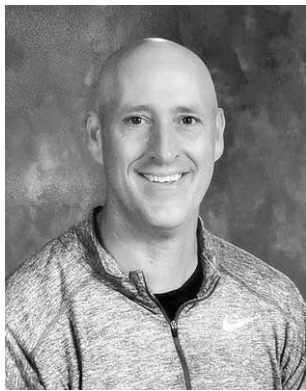

What do you believe is the relationship between the council and commissioners and the auditor's office?

The auditor's office is the pivot point for the entire county government. We handle payroll, payables, receivables and financials. The auditor is not a decision-maker, but the auditor's office is the first place for any decision-maker to research county issues.

One of the many jobs of the auditor's office is to implement the decisions made by the council and commissioners.

Council determines the annual budget, wages, number of employees, and the income tax levy. Once these things are decided, the auditor's office puts them into effect.

Commissioners set county policy. Policies that relate to employees (i.e. work days/hours, holidays, paid-time-off, disciplinary policy) are all put into effect or tracked by the auditor's office.

The relationship between the three units determines the effectiveness on the county. If all three work in union, the more productive and efficient all can be.

What area will be your main focus if elected?

For the past four years, I have worked to digitize the auditor's office. By streamlining the workflow and getting some of the work in electronic form, I have managed to eliminate a position in the office, thereby saving the county approximately \$50,000 per year. I continue to strive in this direction. I do not foresee being able to eliminate another position, but if I can get all the work in the auditor's office in electronic form then I will be in a better position to cover the workload if/when the situation arises — a pandemic, or the loss of a deputy through attrition or something more serious. This will also enable the auditor's office to serve the public and other county departments faster and easier, making our operation more efficient and cost effective.

What experience outside of county government do you bring to the table?

I have 40 years of experience in accounting, individual/corporate tax preparation and 30 years as a licensed CPA. I have held a certified payroll professional (CPP) and a health and life insurance license. I have taught college level accounting, payroll and information technology. I now have four years of experience in the auditor's office, having networked throughout the state with other auditors, the state board of accounts, and the department of local government finance.

PULASKI COUNTY RECORDER

Susan J. "Sue" Fox (R)

What relevant experience do you have related to this position?

Over 21 years of experience working in county government. The past four of those years as the Pulaski County Recorder; 10 of those years working for the Pulaski County Sheriff's Department as a 911 dispatcher and seven of those years as the chief communications officer and 911 supervisor.



Susan J. "Sue" Fox

What area will be your main focus if elected?

My main focus would be to continue the ongoing project of scanning and indexing land documents into our system going back to the 1800s. This will allow abstractors and genealogists to do a more thorough document search online in Doxpop. I would also continue to encourage more title companies, law offices and banks to take advantage of our new e-filing options. Earlier this year we started accepting land transfer documents through e-filing. This was a huge benefit to Pulaski County in that we had it up and running before being struck with the COVID-19 lockdown. The recorder's office already accepted mortgages, mortgage releases and other nontransferable documents through e-filing. With the added transferable documents we were able to keep the recorder's office running during the shutdown. I'm very proud of the accomplishments I've made during my first term and would appreciate the opportunity to continue these projects as your county recorder for a second term.

What experience outside county government do you bring to the table?

I have had the opportunity to work several different types of jobs throughout the years. I've waited tables back in my 20s, worked as a sales clerk, in a factory etc. Each job I had taught me something. I took away from each a new way of looking at life through those experiences. I learned the importance of treating people the way you want to be treated. Being married to a farmer has taught me a tremendous amount. It especially taught me how much a farmer loves the land that he works. Each experience has taught me to take pride in what you do. I've learned to always be open and prepared for change. Kaulig Racing is thrilled to announce Justin Haley will return to the No. 11 Chevrolet for the 2021 NASCAR Xfinity Series season.

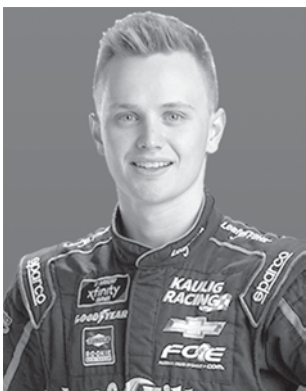
Haley, who originally signed a two-year deal with Kaulig Racing beginning in 2019, has signed a one-year extension, and will be the first driver to return for a third season with the team.
