Winners of NBC's 'The Voice' have Winamac connection

"Girl Named Tom," a band of siblings currently based out of South Bend, has turned heads - and chairs for that matter - on this season of NBC's *The Voice*. The trio was announced as season 21 winners during the live finale of the popular NBC show *The Voice* on Tuesday, Dec. 14. They received \$100,000 and a recording contract.

Although siblings Caleb, Joshua, and Bekah Liechty are from Ohio, interestingly enough, they have a connection to Winamac. They are the grandchildren of the late Dr. Edward Hollenberg, who both practiced in Winamac and helped establish Pulaski Memorial Hospital in 1963. The siblings' mother, Holly (Hollenberg) Liechty, was a graduate of Winamac High School in 1984.

During the blind auditions of *The Voice*, "Girl Named Tom" received a four chair turn from all of the judges on the show, indicating that they all wanted them on their team. The group ultimately chose singer and judge Kelly Clarkson as their coach and made it all the way to the finale. After their first performance at the blind audition, Bekah explained their band name to the judges, stating that her brothers used to call her "Thomas" when she was a baby.

On Monday night, the first part of the finale, the group sang two songs - "The Chain" by Fleetwood Mac and "Baby Now That I Found You" by The Foundations. On Tuesday night the group performed one last time, singing "Leave Before You Love Me" with Clarkson before being announced as the winners of season 21. It was noted during the show that "Girl Named Tom" was the first trio to ever reach the finale.







Trojans snap 52-game losing streak beating Oregon-Davis by Paul Hettinger

The last time the West Central boys' basketball team won a game was Feb. 9, 2019. Who knew that when the Trojans lost to North White six days later, it would start a downward trend that no team should have to endure. The Trojans went on a 52-game losing streak that challenged coaches, players and fans.

When Bernie White took the head coaching job, he knew what he was up against and knew he had the talent to steer the program in the right direction. "Challenges facing me this year are the same for any new coach. Trying to instill a new program with different results is hard and rewarding. Our goal is to be competitive in every game and we are hoping to build a foundation here. People sometimes underestimate the power of hunger. That hunger is starting to show on the court and good things are beginning to happen for the Trojans. After scoring a season-high 59 points Tuesday, West Central surpassed that total Friday night, beating Oregon-Davis 64-60.

West Central got off to a good start taking a 19-13 lead after eight minutes, but Oregon-Davis cut the Trojans' advantage to a basket by the intermission. A quality start to the second half was vital for the Trojans and it would take a solid 16 minutes if they hoped to win. The hosts went right to work, knocking down 17 points and extending their lead to six points. Playing with the lead is something West Central hasn't had the luxury of this season, especially in the fourth quarter. The fate of the game was in the hands of the Trojans and they remained composed, holding off every Bobcat run down the stretch.


The Trojans had four players reach double-digit scoring, led by Carter Lewark, who had 18 points, seven rebounds and four steals. 


